Working with Posts

- **Posts** represent the dynamic part of every WordPress website.
- Through them, users share news, articles, announcements, or blog entries.
- Unlike pages, which are static, posts are displayed chronologically and encourage continuous communication with the audience.
- Working with posts enables users to fully utilise the potential of the CMS system and create content that is informative, structured, and easily accessible.








Accessing the Posts Section

- Posts are accessed from the administrator panel through the Posts section.
- There are four main options available:
 - All Posts displays all existing posts.
 - Add New allows the creation of a new post.
 - Categories used for editing thematic groups.
 - Tags used for defining key labels.
- This structure provides a logical overview and makes it easy to manage all published texts on the website.







Appearance of the Posts Section






Creating a New Post

- By clicking **Add New**, the **Gutenberg editor** opens a tool for visual content editing.
- The user enters the post title, text, images, and other multimedia elements.
- A post can be saved as a **Draft**, previewed through **Preview**, or published by clicking **Publish**.
- This process represents the foundation of **digital literacy** the transition from an idea to publicly visible content.













Gutenberg Editor and Block Logic

- **Gutenberg** operates on the principle of blocks each part of the content (title, text, image, video, quote) represents an independent unit.
- Blocks can be added, moved, and styled, allowing the user to easily shape the appearance of a page without any programming knowledge.
- This modular approach makes WordPress an accessible and flexible tool for creating dynamic web content.







Types of Blocks and Their Application

- The most commonly used blocks are:
 - Paragraph for entering basic text.
 - Heading for titles and subtitles.
 - Image / Gallery for adding images and galleries.
 - List for creating bullet or numbered lists.
 - **Buttons** for calls to action.
 - Quote for quotes and emphasised text.
- Correct use of blocks contributes to the structure, readability, and visual balance of a post.





Text Structure and Headings

- **Headings** (<h1> <h6>) define the reading logic and hierarchy of information.
- The main post title is automatically generated as <h1>, while <h2> and <h3> subheadings are used within the text.
- Short paragraphs (up to four sentences) and clear headings improve content accessibility.
- WordPress posts should be informative yet visually easy to follow.







Adding Multimedia

- By clicking the "+" icon, you can add an Image or Gallery block.
- Images can be uploaded from the computer or selected from the Media Library.
- It is important to add **alt text** a short image description that improves SEO and accessibility.
- The **Mistify** theme automatically optimises image display, adapting it to the screen and site design.
- **WordPress** also allows embedding content from other platforms YouTube videos, Instagram posts, Google Maps, and more.
- To do this, add an **Embed** block and simply paste the URL link.
- The system automatically generates the display within the post.
- This functionality connects different sources of information and increases audience engagement.

Featured Image and Metadata

- A **permalink** (permanent link) is automatically generated based on the post title, but it is recommended to edit it manually.
- The address should be short, readable, and contain relevant keywords (e.g. mojsajt.rs/blog/wordpress-introduction).
- For additional optimisation, plugins such as **Yoast SEO** can be used they allow defining meta descriptions and analysing keyword performance.


Scheduling and Post Status

- WordPress offers several post statuses:
 - **Draft** the post is saved as a draft.
 - **Pending Review** the post is awaiting approval.
 - **Published** the post is live and visible to the public.
 - **Scheduled** the post is set to be published at a future date.
- Users can plan posts in advance, which helps maintain consistent publishing and organised content management.














Editing Existing Posts

- All posts are located in the All Posts section.
- By clicking on a post title, an existing post opens, which can be edited, updated, or deleted.
- WordPress automatically saves previous versions (Revisions), allowing every change to be restored if necessary.
- This functionality enhances both the security and accuracy of content management.

Archives and Content Overview

- Posts can include a comments section.
- The user can moderate comments approve, reject, or delete them.
- Comments increase audience engagement and foster dialogue between the author and readers.
- The **Mistify** theme provides a clean and organised layout for displaying comments.







Archives and Content Overview

- WordPress automatically creates post archives based on categories, tags, authors, and dates.
- Archive pages provide an overview of the publishing history and improve content organisation.
- In this way, the user develops a content structure that is logical, clear, and sustainable in the long term.
