Editing the Blog

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Structure of the Kubio Editor Interface

- The interface is divided into three main zones.
- The **left panel** contains the menu with sections for settings, styles, and element layout.
- The **central area** displays the actual page being edited by the user.
- The **top bar** allows saving, previewing, and switching between views (desktop, tablet, mobile).
- This structure enables the user to see the result of every change immediately, making the design process transparent and visually logical.

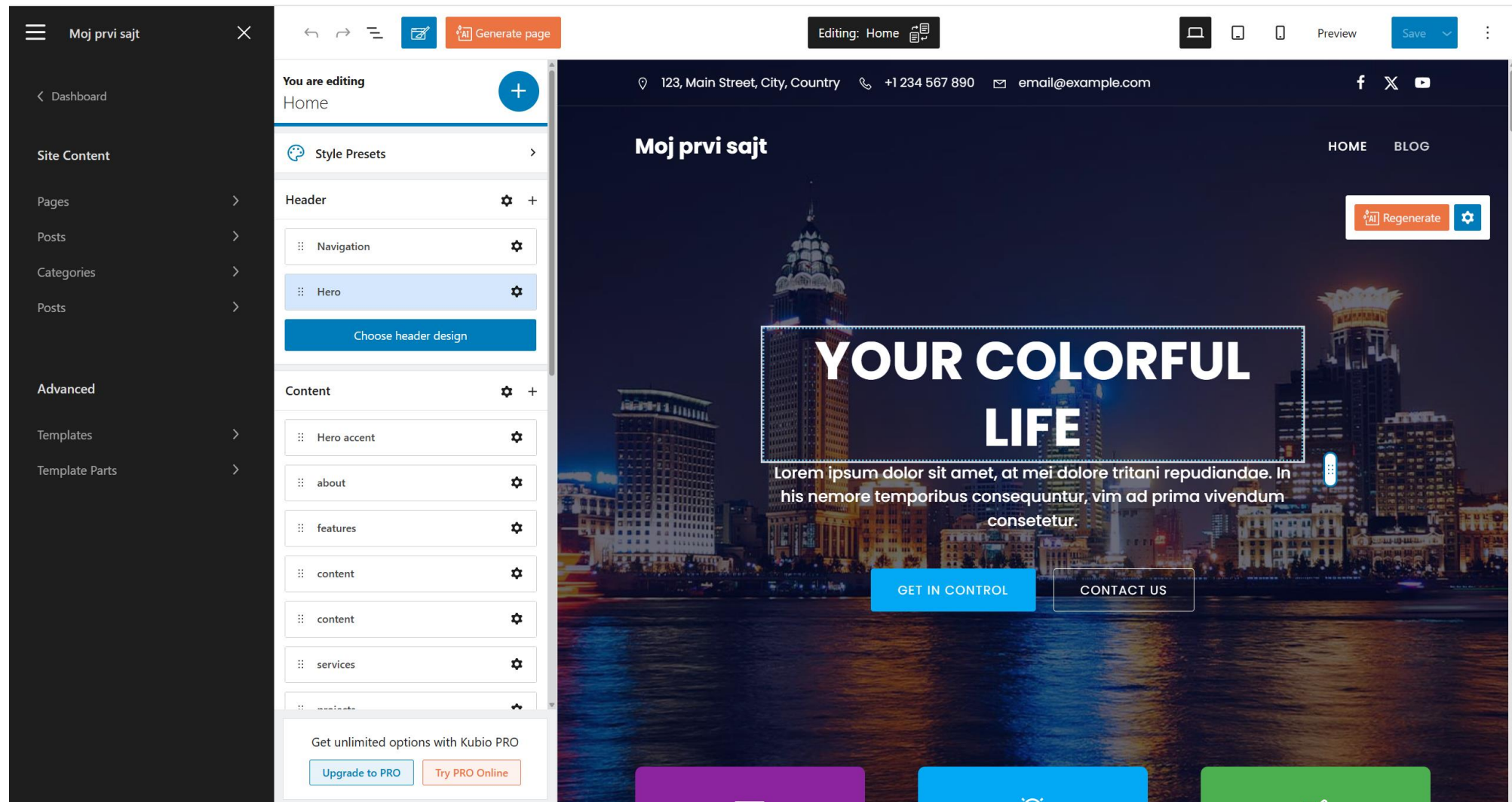


Editing the Blog – Kubio Editor

Accessing the Posts Section

- At the top of the interface, there is a **Toggle Navigation** button that opens and closes the side menu, providing more workspace.
- Within the page, three zones are clearly displayed: **Header**, **Body**, and **Footer**.
- Each zone contains separate modules that can be customised — their order, design, or content can be modified.
- **Kubio** gives the user the ability to design the structure from scratch or to use pre-made blocks as a starting point.

Editing the Header

- The **Header** is the first visual segment a user sees upon opening a website.

Editing the Header

Editing the Footer

- The **Footer** is located at the bottom of each page and represents the final element of the design.
- It usually contains basic information about the website, contact details, links to social media, or copyright notices.
- **Kubio** allows the selection of pre-designed footer templates, as well as manual addition of new columns, text blocks, or icons.
- A functional footer contributes to the professional appearance of the website and makes it easier for users to access important information.

Editing the Footer

Editing the Blog Page Content

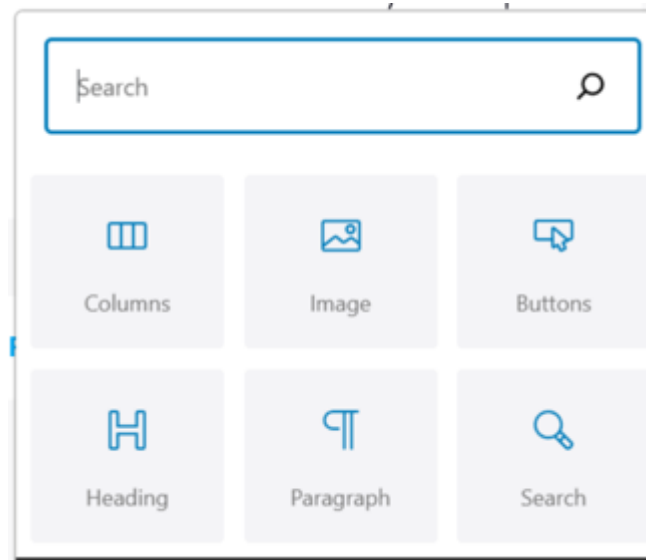
- The **Blog** page displays posts in a list format.
- **Kubio** allows the user to edit every part of the display: column layout, image sizes, colours, margins, and fonts.
- Clicking on any element opens its editing panel.
- The **Latest Posts** block dynamically retrieves the newest posts from the database and displays them in real time.
- In this way, the user learns how dynamic content functions within a static page.



Adding New Blocks and Sections

- Adding new elements in the **Kubio** editor is extremely simple.
- By clicking the blue “+” icon, a new block can be inserted (text, image, gallery, video, button, separator, list).
- Blocks can be dragged with the mouse and positioned wherever the user wants.
- They can be grouped into sections, allowing for a logical and clear organisation of content.
- In this way, each page can be completely unique and tailored to its specific purpose.





Adding New Blocks and Sections



Setting Style and Visual Identity

- The **Style Presets** section in the left panel allows the user to define the website's global visual parameters.
- Here, the main colours, typography, spacing, borders, and backgrounds are configured.
- All changes are automatically applied across all pages of the site, maintaining design consistency.
- In this way, the user creates a recognisable and professional website identity without the need to manually style each element.

Editing a Post in the Kubio Editor

- When a user opens the editor for a specific post (e.g., *Hello World!*), **Kubio** provides full control over its appearance.
- The central area displays the post structure — title, content, image, and meta information (date, author, categories, comments).
- At the top is the **hero section**, which can include a background image, the page title, and navigation.
- Through the left panel, the user can adjust the layout, typography, and colours of each part of the post, as well as replace the page header and footer.
- This approach allows the user to edit not only the text but also its **visual context**.




Customising Content Within a Post


- Each element within a post represents a **block** that can be edited independently.
- Clicking on an image, text, or button opens the side panel with detailed options — adjusting size, margins, alignment, and animations.
- The user can insert new blocks between existing sections, change backgrounds, add galleries, tables, or CTA buttons.
- **Kubio** allows each post to be visually distinct while maintaining the theme's core style.
- In this way, content becomes interactive, engaging, and professionally presented **without any additional coding.**

- **Kubio** provides an instant page preview via the **Preview** button.
